- Governance matters

Securing Benefits in a Season of Insecurity

- No new long-term liability with proposed plan
- Potential reduction of MPP* annuity obligations
- CPP* as potential defense against retirement plan underfunding

Wespath Board of Directors


- Smaller board size

Non-Wespath Special Interest Petitions

Calls for exclusion of "sovereign or government debt of states conducting prolonged military occupations."* This is a new exclusion to ¶717, Sustainable and Socially Responsible Investing.

Two nearly identical petitions seek to exclude government securities from states conducting prolonged military occupations.*

^{*} Affected countries include Israel, Morocco and Turkey

Wespath Does Not Support the Petitions

- Proposed language is overly broad and would create unintended harm
- Wespath's investment process identifies and excludes companies operating in countries posing excessive financial risk
- Petitions misrepresent Wespath's human rights guideline



Wespath's Alternative

 Engagement—Encourage UMC investors to engage government leaders and policymakers to support sustainable,

socially responsible practices

Exclusion—last resort





Connectional Table Proposal

Why a U.S. Regional Conference?

General Conference Petitions

- Many pertain largely or exclusively to the U.S.
- General Conference time and resources spent on matters not relevant to entire UMC
- U.S. Church
 - Venue for U.S.-specific legislation
 - Decision-making authority like central conferences
- General Book of Discipline

Current Model: **Inefficient** for the Church as a global body **Inconsistent** with Church governance outside U.S.



Why Important for Benefit Plans?

- Clergy benefit plans incorporated by reference into *Discipline*
- Plan amendments by General Conference








Connectional Table Proposal Overview

Stage I: U.S. Regional Committee

- Disciplinary and non-Disciplinary changes
- Legislation for GC 2020

Stage II: U.S. Regional Conference


- Changes to the Constitution and Discipline
- More challenging approval requirements for Constitutional amendments

Intended To Be Temporary Step

- Effective immediately following GC 2020
- In place until U.S.
 Regional Conference (Stage II) is functional

Stage I—U.S. Regional Committee

- Consists of all U.S. GC delegates
- Meets immediately prior to GC
- Assigned GC petitions and resolutions that are U.S.-specific
- Different rules from legislative committees for consent calendars



Potential to "fast-track" U.S. legislation on special consent calendar

Stage II—U.S. Regional Conference

- Authority to act for U.S. Church on adaptable matters
- U.S. jurisdictional conferences need not be eliminated
- Similar duties to central conferences
 except duties assigned to jurisdictions



Consistent with Central Conferences governance
